# **ASG ARCHIVES CONSULTANTS VISIT PURPOSE**

Consultants Eira Tansey and Helen Wong Smith were contracted by CoSA (the non-profit Council of State Archivists group) to seek data on Procurement & Disaster Infrastructure and other topics for a CoSA report about American Territorial Archives in the Pacific and Carribean that will be enlightening to administrators & financiers. They are funded under a grant from the ILMS Institute of Library and Museum Services awarded to CoSA a few years ago. An American Territories summit was held at St.

Louis Missouri in the fall of 2024 for this project, which is called AWARE – Archives Working Across Remote Environments, and was attended by the State/Territorial Archivists of Alaska, Am. Samoa, Guam, Hawaii, Puerto Rico, Saipan, and the Virgin Islands. The AWARE project stems from a conversation of State and Territorial Archivists held at their first post-Covid-19 reunion at Nashville Tennessee in 2022.
